**UPDATE FROM HOPE AND AID DIRECT WINTER CONVOY:** As I write this the team are on Lesvos, where the work of distributing the aid has begun. They had a relatively uneventful journey from the UK last week, with just a minor delay to repair the heating system to one of the trucks. The team of five drivers have been joined by four other volunteers who have flown in to assist and they are all now working with NGOs on the ground to ensure the aid goes directly to those who need it. They have met up with Omar who has established a charity 'Refugee for Refugees'. He is an amazing and inspiring man and his group have set up a 'free' shop for refugees in the village of Moria ... fully equipped and stocked. They operate a rotation system for families giving them the dignity to try on clothes and shoes and choose for themselves. A commercial washing machine and dryer have been delivered to the charity 'Together for Better Days', who are working in the Moria camp on Lesvos. Later this week the team will travel to Chios and then back to Athens to deliver the final loads of aid, before embarking on the journey home. Soon after they left the UK last week, I was able to message Charles with the news that I had received another cheque for £1000 from the Partners in Mission. Charles has asked me to tell you that he is extremely grateful for your continued support.... without people such as yourselves they couldn't do what they do. Very best wishes and thanks. Janet
