Of course this is an unexpected extra expense for the charity, as the trip will cost in the region of £8000. It will be a week before the convoy arrive in Samos and unloading can begin. The conditions on the Greek islands do not improve, overcrowding in the camps is at crisis point...will it never end? It is still hoped to arrange the usual Easter convoy so I will update you further as I receive the news. With thanks for your continued support.
