REPORT ON BIKE 'N HIKE 2019: The recent pandemic has distracted from the considerable achievement of the All Saints Team in last September's Bike 'n Hike. We raised the magnificent sum of £1,565.00 and a Silver Award Certificate has been awarded but not yet presented. This was the highest amount collected by any church in the Dunstable Deanery and was nearly 30% of the total collected by all the churches in the Deanery. Overall the Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire Historic Churches Trust has raised more than £95,000 and our contribution was 1.6% of the total. An update from Mother Cate:

I welcome the Government's announcement that Churches will be able to begin opening for worship from the 4th of July. We have not yet received the government guidance on what this might mean and how it might happen.
