

**POSSIBLE EASING OF RESTRICTIONS FROM 19TH JULY:**

As we now confidently expect most restrictions to be lifted on the 19th we will be planning accordingly and will confirm our arrangements next Sunday, 18th July. We are awaiting the requirements for wearing face coverings which is currently a legal obligation. We expect that track and trace will cease to be required. Regarding worship we expect that social distancing will end and that most of Church will go back to normal and we will be able to chat with each other inside our building. We are planning to keep an area of seating that will remain socially distanced for those who may prefer this or who are more vulnerable.

Please do be considerate of others as we go through this time of transition, not everyone may be ready to jump straight into a life with few protections at this time with infections rising. You will need to be sensitive and respectful to those around you, and may wish to continue wearing a face covering in some circumstances. There will be people who hold a variety of views within our congregation and I want everyone to feel that they are welcome in our Church.

No timetable has been given by the Church of England regarding the resumption of the common cup and I fully expect that communion in one kind will continue until the number of cases starts to come down.
