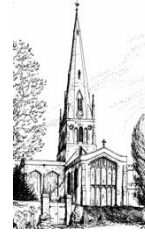

We are planning to keep an area of seating that will remain socially distanced for those who may prefer this or who are more vulnerable.

You will need to be sensitive and respectful to those around you, and may wish to continue wearing a face covering in some circumstances. No timetable has been given by the Church of England regarding the resumption of the common cup and I fully expect that communion in one kind will continue until the number of cases starts to come down.
