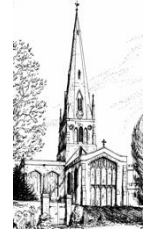

BIKE 'N HIKE 2021: Bike 'n Hike is the Beds & Herts Historic Churches Trust's major
fund-raising effort to provide grants for repairs and restoration of churches in the two
counties. I'm sure that you know by now that half of the money comes back to All
Saints so it also an important Fund Raiser for us as well. Last year despite the pandemic,
the Trust managed to raise nearly £113,000 and, with the support of other Trusts,
awarded over £160,000 to 23 Churches in the Counties. This meant an average of
£7000 for each church, so this is a relatively small sum compared to the overall cost of
many of the repairs. More money is needed so please help us to do even better this
year. It's not too late to sponsor us to help raise money to repair Historic Churches
