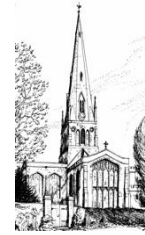

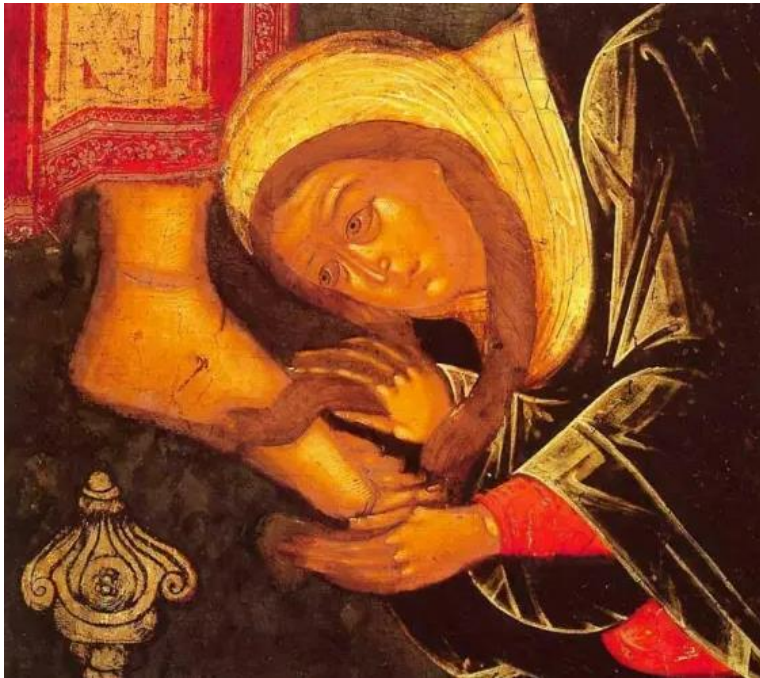
EASTER SUNDAY: Don't forget to bring your Bonnets for the Easter Parade!
