# Holy Week

Dear Friends.

Our pilgrimage journey is almost at an end. We come together to rejoice of our Lord riding into Jerusalem or a donkey. Whilst we rejoice, Jesus is contemplating what lies ahead for him over the coming week. He knows that he will have to go through a Last Supper, a betrayal by one of his friends. He will then be humiliated in front of a huge crowd and sentenced to a cruel death. Stripped and nailed to a cross.

As we enter this final week before we sit on Good Friday at the foot of the cross, I'd like to encourage you to reflect on the last seven words Jesus spoke.

"Father forgive them, for they know not what they do."

"Today you will be with me in paradise."

"Woman, behold your son!" "Behold your mother."

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

"I thirst."

"It is finished."

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

The seven words of Jesus on the cross we will be looking at during Holy Week and in the second hour of Good Friday. I encourage you to join us each evening for a Eucharist and to reflect on each of these.

Jesus's words on the cross show his love, forgiveness, and willingness to give his life.

Forgiveness, Jesus gave his torturers, even while suffering unimaginable pain.

Love, Jesus's love is unconditional and divine

Willingness to give his life, Jesus chose to give his life, even though he could've remained alive and used his divine authority.

Completion of his mission, Jesus's words it is finished about the completion of his mission to redeem humanity through his death and resurrection.

May you have a fruitful, prayerful and engaging whole week as we prepare ourselves in a week's time to rejoice and saying as many hallelujahs as we can.
