I came upon this quote from a football manager. "Christmas is important but Easter is decisive" Arsène Wenger.

I don't mean to be flippant about the season of Advent and Christmas but, as a nation, we spend far more time preparing for a baby to be born in a stable than we do for the Son of God to be risen from the dead. I will just take you back through the last few days.

We began on Palm Sunday singing and shouting out as we welcomed Jesus on a donkey into his hometown of Jerusalem.

On Maundy Thursday we have the last supper and Jesus asking us to "do this in remembrance of me" as often as we can. This was after he had washed his disciples feet. Judas was necessary otherwise Easter could never be. The Scriptures had to be fulfilled and he betrayed Jesus.

On Good Friday, we have the trial, the judgement and the crucifixion. All of these events had to occur so that Jesus could rise from the dead on Easter day.

You may not have sent lots of cards to your friends and your family. You may not have bought and wrapped up gifts. You may not have had an Easter work party in a local pub or restaurant and I'm sure you won't have decorated the inside of your house or put lots of lights on outside for all to see. In a way, we don't need to do all of that for Easter because it is the most glorious gift given to us by God . A gift of the risen Christ who is defied death and given us his unconditional love to all who turned to Him. He has broken down the barriers of sin and shown us how, through the new covenant we should love one another.

Easter is decisive. It requires us to give thanks and worship our Lord, to break bread together, and to shout out to anyone who we meet. Alleluia Christ is Risen.
