I hope that during the last few weeks you have been able to enjoy the warm summer. For many people, this has been the season of holidays, visiting friends and families and stepping out from everyday life.

I have been reminded by many people, that after having had some time out, they hadn't realised how tired they had been. Even the church has had a time of rest and quietness during the summer holidays.

Rest is a very important part of our Christian life and yet it's often neglected for all sorts of good reasons. I would like to encourage you to not just be recharged during a holiday but to take time out each week to rest and to sit with God. For many, that is on a Sunday coming to Church. Try not to disturb the Church or Church folk on that day so they have an opportunity to rest in Christ too. I hope that now we have returned back to our daily lives that you feel rested from the summer holidays and invigorated for what is to come over the next few months.
