"Keep Praying and Don't Lose Heart" - Reflection on Luke 18:1-8

In this week's Gospel, Jesus tells the story of a widow who refuses to give up. She keeps coming to an unjust judge, pleading for justice until he finally gives in - not because he is good, but because she is persistent. Jesus uses this simple but powerful story to remind us to "pray always and not lose heart."

It's easy to become discouraged when our prayers seem unanswered or when the world feels unjust. Yet, this parable teaches us that God is not like the reluctant judge. Our loving Father hears every cry, treasures every prayer, and acts with perfect justice and mercy - though not always in the timing or way we expect.

Faith, Jesus tells us, is not passive - it's active, patient, and persistent. Like the widow, we are called to keep turning to God in prayer, trusting that He is listening and working even when we cannot see it.

So this week, let's take heart. Let's keep praying for peace, for loved ones, for healing, for hope - and trust that our persistence in faith will draw us ever closer to the heart of God.

"When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on the earth?" (Luke 18:8) May He find it in us - faith that prays, hopes, and never gives up.
